# Galien Township

### **History**

Galien Township took its name from the Galien River which had, in turn, been named by the early French explorers for Father René Brehant de Galineé, a map maker by origin and a good friend of Father Marquette. The French name Galineé was "Americanized" in 1836 to become Galien. The entire Township was once part of the "Galien Woods" -- an extremely dense forest of maple, beech, white oak and black walnut trees. The only thoroughfares available were those made by animals which were, subsequently, adopted by the local Indian tribes. Interestingly enough, these roadways became the settling points for many of the pioneers.

The first settler in the Township was Samuel Garwood, who had been attracted by the dense woods and the gentle waters of the Galien River. Captivated by the beautiful area, John Johnson and James Wilson decided to join Garwood as the next permanent settlers. The latter built the Township's first sawmill in 1836.

Galien Township, originally part of Bertrand then later Weesaw Township, was incorporated as a separate township on February 29, 1844. William Burns was elected the first supervisor and Samuel Garwood became the first treasurer. In 1861, the small village of Galien was laid out within the Township and became the center of all business activities. The appearance and character of the Township has changed little over the past century-and-a-half.

#### **Observations**

Galien Township is everything one would expect to find in an old-fashioned, rural setting. The Township is beautifully located on U.S. 12, which provides good access to its industrial park. Located near I-94 and U.S. 31, it is only a few miles from the shores of Lake Michigan. The surrounding communities offer art centers, antique stores, theaters, a botanical garden and shopping malls. Galien's location provides easy access to several transportation service providers.

Although industries are welcomed in the industrial park located in the Village, the community would like to preserve its status quo as a traditional farming community, enjoying the resulting quality of life.

For some, the degree of social control in this small community may be a drawback -- for others it provides safety and comfort. For those who like the outdoors and prefer the quiet after a busy day at the office, Galien Township is a pleasant place to live.

## **Community Vision**

In the next two decades, the community would like to:

- Maintain the status quo of a traditional farming community.
- B. Attract industry to the industrial park.
- Install a municipal water system to serve the community and its industrial park.
- D. Construct a driveway to ease entry into the industrial park.
- Encourage residential growth to help cover needed expenditures.


